



SCHOOLS MONKEYPOX

At this time, the risk of monkeypox to children and adolescents in the United States is low.

A FEW TIPS FOR PREVENTION

	<h3>Stay Home When Sick</h3> <p>This includes children, staff, and volunteers staying home when sick, ensuring access to adequate handwashing supplies, including soap and water, maintaining routine cleaning and disinfection practices.</p>
	<h3>Spaces for Assessment</h3> <p>Identifying private spaces for an ill child away from others.</p>
	<h3>Provide Personal Protective Equipment</h3> <p>Provide personal protective equipment (PPE) for staff who care for students with infectious diseases.</p>
	<h3>Vaccination</h3> <p>Vaccinations are recommended for high risk groups. Check with your local health care facility to determine if you should be vaccinated.</p>
